#### **Psalm 51:1-10**

**New Revised Standard Version (NRSV)**

- 1** Have mercy on me, O God,  
according to your steadfast love;  
according to your abundant mercy,  
blot out my transgressions.
- 2** Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity,  
and cleanse me from my sin.
- 3** For I know my transgressions,  
and my sin is ever before me.
- 4** Against you, you alone, have I sinned  
and done what is evil in your sight,  
so that you are justified in your sentence  
and blameless when you pass judgment.
- 5** Indeed, I was born guilty,  
a sinner when my mother conceived me.
- 6** You desire truth in the inward being;  
therefore teach me wisdom in my secret heart.
- 7** Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean;  
wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow.
- 8** Let me hear joy and gladness;  
let the bones that you have crushed rejoice.
- 9** Hide your face from my sins,  
and blot out all my iniquities.
- 10** Create in me a clean heart, O God,  
and put a new and right spirit within me.
