A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR CHRIS - APRIL SHOWERS?



Have you been paying attention to the weather lately? There is an old saying attributed from the poem of a 16th Century Englishman named Thomas Tusser: *April showers bring May flowers*. At the time of the writing of the May newsletter, depending on where one is located, Tennesseans find themselves in areas of moderate to extreme drought. In fact, 45 out of 50 states are experiencing drought conditions this year. Where are the April showers? While the beautiful sunny days have been a dream for many outdoor enthusiasts, spring ballgames, and construction workers, there are many in our community such as farmers, gardeners, and businesses who find themselves praying for more rain.

The weather is unpredictable, and while science can help us better understand weather patterns, climate change and its effects, the weather has a way of humbling us fast. Many of us are still traumatized by the effects of Helene on our community in 2024. I have a colleague who refuses to stay at his home near a river when it rains. After what he went through, I can't blame him.

In Luke 12:54-56, Jesus speaks to the crowds about the weather. He rebukes them for being so adept at predicting the weather patterns of rain from the west or heat from the south, while failing to recognize the urgent signs of God's kingdom in the present time and the arrival of the Messiah. People could read the sky but they couldn't see the significance of Jesus' teachings and actions. Those kinds of things were not on their "radar" (no pun intended 😊).

While I am no meteorologist, I am a pastor. It is always my hope and my prayer that as God's people, we would open our eyes to the spiritual, as much as the physical, surroundings. What are the signs of hope, the situations of need, or the warning signs of caution, as individuals and as Christian community, that we might be missing? In the meantime, let's keep praying for more rain.

May he be like rain that falls on the mown grass, like showers that water the earth! – Psalm 72:6

WELCOME TO ANNA COOPER. OUR SUMMER EMORY & HENRY SCHOLAR INTERN

This summer we are participating in a new ministry partnership between Munsey Memorial United Methodist Church, First Broad Street United Methodist Church (Kingsport, TN), and Emory and Henry University (Emory, VA) called the *Emory and Henry Scholars Internship*. Beginning in late May, Munsey will share a ministry intern for ten weeks with First Broad Street. The intern selected is Anna Cooper. A little about Anna:

My name is Anna Cooper. I am 21 years old and a Vocal Music Education major at Emory and Henry University. I grew up a member of Church Street United Methodist Church in Knoxville, TN, and there served as a Youth Representative on the church council board; sang in the choir and youth band; volunteered in the soup kitchen, Wesley House, and Beacon of Hope; and so much more. Church Street gave me many opportunities to travel across the country, but one of our most memorable expeditions was to Resurrection in Pigeon Forge. There, I spoke to Emory & Henry's spiritual life students and knew this was the right school for me. I was already familiar with E&H as my dad and great-grandfather attended, but the school's Methodist connection was a big draw for me.

My favorite food is sushi! Nothing with shellfish though, I am sadly allergic. I love to bird and to organize. I love going for short walks and listening and looking for birds. My favorite place to bird is Seven Islands in Knoxville. I also love to organize, whether that be a closet, a pantry, or even a storage unit- I love to put items into a designated place. My favorite Bible verse is Psalm 100:1-5.

This summer, I am hoping for a community connection through this internship. I do want to help bridge First Broad Street and Munsey and Emory and Henry. I hope for new experiences and lifelong memories.

She will stay with a couple of families at Munsey and First Broad Street throughout the summer. Her schedule and time between the churches is still being finalized. MARCH MELTING POT STATISTICS

In March, we served 267 people breakfast on Saturday mornings, plus three “to-go” bags for latecomers and four food boxes for hungry families through the Melting Pot food pantry. We provided lunch on two Saturdays, while our ministry partner, *Feeding in Action*, provided lunch on the remaining Saturdays. On March 14, we held the first of our monthly medical clinics during Saturday morning Shepherd’s Breakfast. We had 221 people who joined us for a light meal and Sunday worship in March. We gave out eight food boxes on Sunday mornings.

NORTH SIDE ELEMENTARY—A GREAT PLACE TO BE!

Carl Jung once said, "One looks back with appreciation to the brilliant teachers, but with gratitude to those who touched our human feelings." When walking down the hallways at North Side and observing the interactions of teachers and students, one realizes the amazing relationship between them. Twice a year, Munsey holds a luncheon for the teachers and staff to show our appreciation for their service to the students.

In April, we fed 80 teachers, staff and student teachers a Chick-fil-A box lunch. They received a chicken sandwich, chips, a cookie, and a drink. In addition, we had a door prize drawing for seven potted flowers, two \$20 Books-A-Million gift cards, two \$20 Johnson's Literary Depot gift cards, and a floral centerpiece. Needless to say, the teachers stopped by all day to give us an additional thank you.

April also is TCAP time in Tennessee. For 154 students, this meant 5 days of testing in language arts, math and science. Thanks to Munsey, they were able to snack on 398 cheese crackers, 172 grain bars, 220 fruit snacks, and 137 various cookies. They washed those down with 400 drinks. Plus, we were able to donate 436 bottles of water for Field Day and 18 boxes of Kleenex.

This month, we will be collecting items for Related Arts teachers (STEM, Art, PE, Library and Guidance). There will be lists of supplies needed at each Missions table and at the Connection Point. Thank you, Munsey, for helping with this vital partnership.

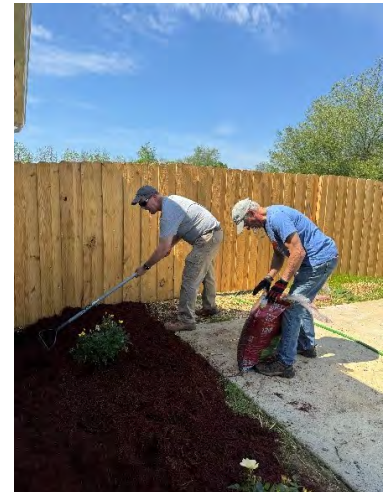
EMBREEVILLE FLOOD RECOVERY WORK CONTINUES

April was a busy month for outdoor projects for our Embreeville families. On April 18, Dave Culberson, Trish Patterson, and Robert and Cheryl Maner planted azalea and knock out rose bushes at the home of the Marins, a new family added to our Embreeville group. This ASP home was built in town off Montgomery Street. In addition to the plants, landscape fabric and mulch were also installed. The project was supported by Bruce Treadway (Washington County Long Term Recovery Group) with tools and materials.

Another project where "many Munsey hands make light work" was for David Harris and Carolyn Garland ("Cattfish" and "Gator Bait"), another of our Embreeville families! Steve Hale, Joe Wolfe, and Frank Morrison met at Dave Culberson's house on April 21, to build a 4'x8' raised bed

garden for Cattfish. Bruce Treadway provided a truck and trailer to deliver the finished project to Embreeville, and on April 23, Jim Hughes and Bruce finished the project by adding the garden soil. Gardening is one of Cattfish's favorite hobbies and is good therapy for his lingering Vietnam war PTSD. He and Carolyn lost their home, along with their garden, a fishing pond and most of their topsoil during the flood, so he was overjoyed to receive this Munsey gift.

MUNSEY SPOTLIGHT: "ALL IN" WITH MIKE AND CARLENE CHRISTIAN

Mike and Carlene Christian have taken different paths to Munsey Memorial, but those paths have a lot in common. Both grew up in the Methodist tradition. Both found deep roots here through the Virgil Anderson Sunday School class. And both, after walking through some of life's hardest seasons within these walls, found each other.

Carlene has been a member since 1994, when she and her late husband, Vance, returned to Johnson City. Vance went on to teach the Virgil Anderson class for 16 years, a role that shaped the community deeply. Mike joined in 1999 after his neighbor, Lewis Wexler, invited him and his late wife, Nancy, to that same class. "We didn't church shop at all after that," Mike says. "We knew we had a home."

In the years that followed, both families walked a similar road. Nancy was diagnosed with Alzheimer's, and Vance developed age-related dementia. Mike and Carlene each became caregivers for their spouses who died about four years ago, within six weeks of one another. During these trying events, the Virgil Anderson class cared for them both, with cards, visits, love, and prayers.

After years of caregiving and following months of grieving their separate loses, Mike and Carlene began participating in the Sunday School class's small groups (who meet to eat and fellowship) and began to truly get to know one other. "I thought, he's just a really neat guy," she says. They married two years ago in July, and invited the Virgil Anderson class to their wedding. "They are our family," Carlene says simply.

That family still gathers weekly, averaging around 50 people in the Christian Life Center Meeting Room with others joining by Zoom. The class is a "church within a church," funding Liberia backpacks, supporting the Melting Pot, and distributing charitable gifts each Christmas based on suggestions from members. "I've never known a community of folks that take care of one another like that class does," Mike says.

Both Carlene and Mike are "all in" at Munsey in their own ways. Carlene serves wherever she is needed, filling in for Matthew Brickey on the organ, playing in the handbell choir, helping in the Melting Pot, and recently reaching out to members who hadn't yet scheduled church directory photos. "That's not my comfort zone," she admits. "But I stepped out of that zone because I knew the church needed help." Mike, who describes himself as more of a behind-the-scenes supporter, says his role is simple: doing whatever he can to support Carlene's volunteering, and supporting the church through his stewardship.

For Carlene, few moments capture what Munsey means to her quite like communion. "Watching our church family come forward to share in the body of Christ is so moving. These people, some I know and others I've yet to meet, are all family!" she says.

A MESSAGE ABOUT PLANNED GIVING

"Jesus Loves Me." It really isn't any more complicated than that. The beloved hymn by that name we all sang in Sunday School stays with us, like riding a bike. Even now I bet you are humming the melody to yourself.

Anna B. Warner wrote the lyrics, as well as numerous novels and children's books, often with her older sister, Susan. Neither married, but each lived a long and fruitful life. When their mother died when Anna and Susan were young, they were raised by an aunt while their father, Henry Warner, practiced law in New York City. Henry lost it all in the Panic of 1837, so the family moved permanently to their summer residence at Constitution Island, a redoubt in the Hudson River across from West Point. Thomas Warner, Henry's brother, was the chaplain there. Anna and Susan taught Bible classes to the cadets for forty years. Anna's online biography says future president Dwight Eisenhower was one of the last to attend her classes.

Besides all that, Anna wrote *Gardening by Myself*. Try this on for a representative quotation: "In one's garden as in the world, one must learn to be content; even when the blooming successes are passed by, and the failures picked out; wearing there, as elsewhere, the ornament of a meek and quiet spirit, which in the sight of God is of great price." My how those 19th century writers could go on.

I hope everyone who reads this leaves as bountiful a legacy as Anna B. Warner. Even if you don't, think about a gift or bequest to Munsey Church. It may not make you hum, but it will make your heart sing. ~John Taylor, *Chair of Planned Giving*
