A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR KIP



Leslie Weatherhead, the noted British Methodist clergyman and psychologist, told about a young, brilliant physician he met in London who was making a number of experiments in a laboratory attached to the university. He was doing cancer research supported by some of the most distinguished scientists in London. Weatherhead said he watched him work in a small, ill-ventilated room in the basement of the university. The doctor told Weatherhead that if these experiments turned out as successfully as he had every right to hope they would, then he would have a new way of treating this particular cancer with some hope of recovery. Weatherhead asked him, "What will you then do?" With a glow on his face, with enthusiasm in his voice, and a shining gleam in his eye he exclaimed, "I shall tell the world!"

This reminds me that we should come to worship each Sunday with great expectations, a glow on our faces, enthusiasm in our voices, and a shining gleam in our eyes, for we too have made a discovery! Jesus Christ is Lord and He is among His people. Christ has come to set the captive free! We really do have a story to tell the nations!
