**1 As a deer longs for flowing streams,
so my soul longs for you, O God.**

**2 My soul thirsts for God,
for the living God.**

**When shall I come and behold
the face of God?**

**3 My tears have been my food
day and night,
while people say to me continually,
“Where is your God?”**

**4 These things I remember,
as I pour out my soul:
how I went with the throng
and led them in procession to the house of God,
with glad shouts and songs of thanksgiving,
a multitude keeping festival.**

**5 Why are you cast down, O my soul,
and why are you disquieted within me?
Hope in God, for I shall again praise him,
my help 6 and my God.**
