A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR CHRIS - A SANCTUARY BIRD



The early service on Mother's Day at 9am in the Sanctuary was eventful to say the least. About thirty minutes before the service's prelude was set to begin, a European starling decided to grace us with its presence in the sanctuary. While some of the worship staff managed to trap the bird in the right front window shutters until a better plan of extraction might be crafted following the service, the starling was less than satisfied with its

containment. Midway through the sermon, as I prepared to deliver home the main points of the morning message, the starling burst through the shutters, much to the surprise (and audible gasps) of the congregation. Before flying around the room and landing on a few parishioners (Bill Breeding tells me it's not the first time a bird landed on his head.), the bird stopped for a moment on the lectern, with a parallel view of congregation, as I nervously tried to keep the sermon going. Fortunately, no one was harmed during the encounter of this unexpected visitor, and the bird was safely captured and released back into the Johnson City sky.

I was surprised to find out that this is not the first time a bird has flown around the sanctuary during a morning worship service, and apparently this has happened on a previous Mother's Day. Given the nooks and crannies in the Munsey ceiling and steeple, the chances are a visit to our sanctuary from a winged friend won't be the last.

Then, on Pentecost Sunday, a different kind of bird was seen flying around the sanctuary, this time during the choral processional. However, this bird was made of fabric, and it was a planned visit. Attached to a pole with a long red ribbon, the bird danced in the movement to the hymn "O Spirit of the Living God." It's unfortunate that our bird friend from Mother's Day had not shown up on Pentecost Sunday, for the people of Munsey would have thought the worship staff had really stepped up their game!

Birds are mentioned many times in the scriptures. Most prominent is the dove, who brought back an olive branch for Noah, or more famously is depicted as a representation of the Holy Spirit. A Psalmist speaks of God like an eagle carrying its young on its wings. Elijah was visited and brought food by a raven in the wilderness. And it is Jesus who mentions the sparrows to illustrate God's care for creation.

As an amateur birder myself (Suzanne's stepfather, Bill, is an ornithologist.), I love to study birds. On Mother's Day, it was the first time I felt a bird was watching me. Maybe this was a sign? Did the bird have something to say when it landed on that lectern? Pentecost reminds us that the Holy Spirit is capable of holy, powerful, chaotic moments. In a place like Munsey, where order and planning have been part of a long legacy of great ministry, perhaps, a little holy chaos every now and then is a bit of a good thing. Thanks to the bird, the congregation on Mother's Day was treated to a quick, abbreviated sermon. As a result, while I am not certain, I may have heard a faint "hallelujah" from someone in the back. See, miracles do happen! Have a blessed month of June!

FAMILY PROMISE

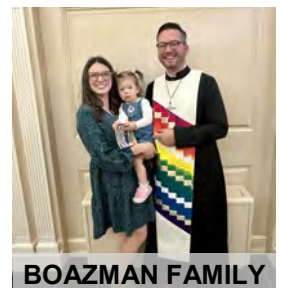

APRIL MELTING POT STATISTICS

In April, we served 271 people breakfast on Saturday morning, plus 3 to-go bags for latecomers and 1 food box for a hungry family with resources from the small Melting Pot food pantry. We also provided lunch on 2 Saturdays, while our ministry partner, Feeding in Action, provided lunch on the remaining Saturdays. In addition, we sponsored a street outreach where Melting Pot ministries gave away food, socks, water, and hygiene items. We had 100 people who joined us for a light meal and Sunday worship in April, plus 1 food box distributed. MUNSEY SPOTLIGHT: NATE SPIVEY. OUR SUMMER MISSIONS INTERN

We're delighted to have Nate Spivey join us this summer as our Missions Intern! Nate began visiting Munsey this spring, and we hope you'll give him a warm Munsey welcome when you see him around church. I grew up in church, but I wasn't truly saved until my freshman year of college. Since pursuing my walk with Jesus, I've been able to find peace and direction in a difficult world, and my faith has continued to grow stronger.

What brought me to Munsey was meeting two faithful servants, Dave Culberson and Susan Wexler Ellis. From the conversations I had with them, I could tell that Munsey Methodist Church was fruitful, welcoming, and a place where I could continue growing in my faith. Their kindness and love for Christ made a strong impression on me, and I knew this was where God was leading me.

I am majoring in Health Administration. My favorite foods are steak and grilled chicken, and I enjoy pretty much any competitive sport, although basketball is definitely my favorite.

One of my favorite Bible verses is 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18: "Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus."

Through this internship experience, I hope to grow spiritually, strengthen my leadership and communication skills, and learn how to better serve others while living out my faith in everyday life.

A MESSAGE ABOUT PLANNED GIVING

My generation grew up with what were derisively called the "rural comedies" on television. These included *Petticoat Junction*, *The Beverly Hillbillies*, and, perhaps the worst offender, *Green Acres*. I'll leave it to your curiosity to investigate the bases for these shows and what drove their popularity at the time. Suffice to say, country come to town, or the reverse, backed up by a laugh track, were the common denominators. They will live on, oftentimes in their original black and white, as long as programmers think enough of us will still watch them. I'll confess, I regularly watched them at the time, and still enjoy the adventures of a "Man named Jed" when I'm feeling nostalgic.

Lumped in with these offerings was *The Andy Griffith Show*. And, when it came time to send the "rural comedies" packing, it was likewise on the chopping block. This was a mistake. Andy Griffith was the sheriff of Mayberry, North Carolina, a fictitious hamlet about the size of Erwin that was patterned after Griffith's hometown of Mount Airy. Every week we were treated to the homespun, gentle humor of Sheriff Andy, Deputy Barney Fife, Aunt Bea, Floyd the Barber, Otis Campbell, and drop-in characters like Ernest T. Bass and the Darling Family. In thirty minutes, Andy would either get Barney out of trouble, fix his son, Opie's, problems with his teacher, or instruct an interloper into bucolic Mayberry that the simple ways are the best. The writing, acting, and directing were first-rate and have stood the test of time. It was "rural" only in the sense of its setting.

For this writing, one episode stands out. A parishioner of the Mayberry Baptist Church left a five hundred dollar bequest, to be used as the church saw fit. Naturally, a committee was formed. Practical Andy wanted to fix the church's shaky foundation. Aunt Bea wanted new choir robes. Elmo offered a compromise: let's get a pool table to go in the basement. Tempers flared, feelings were bruised, but all turned out well. A clever way to fix the foundation for free allowed the funds to be spent on the choir robes. The episode ends with the newly robed choir and laity singing *The Sevenfold Amen*, while a hose runs outside during the service, lowering the "good" side of the church down to the level of the eroded side.

This Hollywood ending might not have been necessary had multiple members left the Mayberry Baptist Church sufficient funds for both worthy projects. I hope readers who want to help Munsey Church take this to heart. Ask any staff member how to get started. But be forewarned: we do not need a pool table. ~John Taylor, Chair of Planned Giving (Endowment).

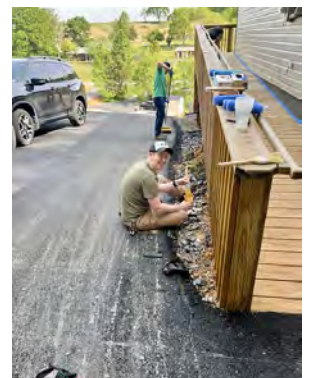
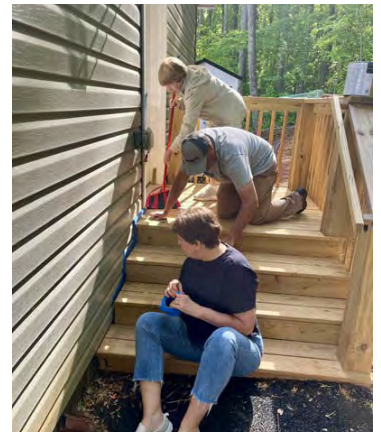
THE GRAND FINALE

Munsey Staff and laity recently helped our friends in Embreeville work on staining their new decks! We will be having another workday in July and hope you will be a part of it.

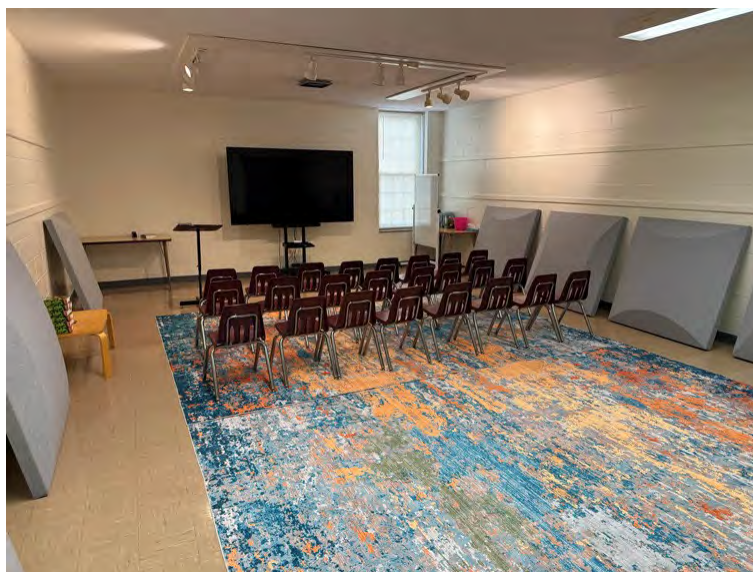
