# A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR KIP



In his bestselling book, *Disappointment with God*, Philip Yancey relates a touching story from his own life. One time on a visit to his mother who had been widowed years earlier, in the month of Philip's first birthday, they spent the afternoon together looking through a box of old photos. A certain picture of him as an eight-month-old baby caught his eye. Tattered and bent, it looked too banged up to be worth keeping, so he asked her why, with so many other better pictures of him at the same age, she had kept this one.

Yancey writes, "My mother explained to me that she had kept the photo as a memento, because during my father's illness it had been fastened to his iron lung." During the last four months of his life, Yancey's father lay on his back, completely paralyzed by polio at the age of twenty-four, encased from the neck down in a huge, cylindrical breathing unit. With his two young sons banned from the hospital due to the severity of his illness, he had asked his

wife for pictures of her and their two boys. Because he was unable to move even his head, the photos had to be jammed between metal knobs so that they hung within view above him, the only thing he could see. The last four months of his life were spent looking at the faces he loved.

Philip Yancey continues, "I have often thought of that crumpled photo, for it is one of the few links connecting me to the stranger who was my father. Someone I have no memory of, no sensory knowledge of, spent all day, every day thinking of me, devoting himself to me, loving me . . . The emotions I felt when my mother showed me the crumpled photo were the very same emotions I felt that February night in a college dorm room when I first believed in a God of love. Someone is there, I realized. Someone is there who loves me. It was a startling feeling of wild hope, a feeling so new and overwhelming that it seemed fully worth risking my life on."

His father's love, even though he has no real memory of his father, helped him move forward in life. And, as he would be the first to acknowledge, any parent's love is but a pale reflection of the love God has for each of us.

The month of May marks the celebration of Confirmation Sunday and Mother's Day, which reminds us how important faith formation is in our lives, and how we bare the exciting responsibility to pass on our faith in important ways to the generations that come after us.

May will also be a time when I will be sharing my final sermon series with you – "Victory in the Valleys of Life." In this series that will culminate on June 15, my intention is to share with you the biblical pictures and stories of people just like us who walked though challenging times, but found the strength to press forward in a way that strengthened their faith. That is my sincere hope for all of us.

So please mark your calendar, bring your friends and family, and join me for these important days together. I look forward to seeing you in worship each week!

#### **MEAL MINISTRY**

Thank you to all the wonderful volunteers who have cooked casseroles for our meal ministry! We are now ready to open up this ministry to the church!

#### Who can receive a casserole?

Anyone who needs some extra love or support. Is someone in your Sunday School class sick or having surgery? Did you just talk to a friend going through a hard time? If so, bring them a casserole!

#### How does it work?

First, call the person who would be receiving the casserole and make sure they don't have any allergies. Next, go to the freezer (access through the walk-in refrigerator) and look for the pink signs. The casseroles are labeled, and there is a clipboard to sign out who is delivering, who is receiving, etc. This helps ensure that we do not deliver multiple meals, and it helps me know who I need to check on! Finally, deliver the meal and make someone's day a little easier!

# When can I drop by to pick up a casserole for delivery?

The church has Connection Point volunteers Monday - Thursday mornings, but it is best to call the office at 423-461-8070 before coming. Of course, you can always grab one when you come for worship on Sunday mornings.

#### What if I can't deliver it?

If you know of someone who could benefit from this ministry, but you are not available to deliver, that is okay! Please contact me, and I will do my best to deliver it or find a volunteer.

#### What else do I need to know?

Make sure your casserole has been labeled with the cooking instructions. The labels sometimes come off due to the extreme cold. The date listed is the expiration date; frozen casseroles should last 3-6 months, but we are using 3 months as our expiration. If you would prefer to take the casserole home, cook it, and deliver it as a full meal with salad and bread, please do! **How can I help continue this ministry?** 

We cannot have too many volunteers! If you would like to be on the list of people we contact when the supply is running low, please let me know. We will be opening up this ministry very soon to include bread and desserts. If you would like to help with that or if you could deliver occasionally, please let me know. *Emily Ham, RN* parishnurse@munsey.org

# MISSIONS UPDATES

#### **MELTING POT**

The Melting Pot and Anthony Jackson, Melting Pot Facilitator, were featured on News Channel 11 (WJHL) with coverage of the Easter breakfast and service held on April 20. Coverage included information about the weekly Shepherd's Breakfast (served on Saturdays) and the weekly Open Door worship service (held on Sundays). In his interview, Anthony shared, "We just really try to keep it focused on people's situations. So people who are not really used to being in a traditional church setting, they often don't receive a traditional message the same way. We just try to tailor towards how Jesus is relevant in their life and their situation. We just want them to know that he's always present." April was a busy month for the ministries of the Melting Pot. The Shepherd's Breakfast served more than 300 people and began distributing food boxes. The Melting Pot is able to be the hands and feet of Jesus through the volunteer efforts of many individuals and groups, including ETSU med school students and the Women Hikers of Northeast Tennessee. #### FLOOD RECOVERY TASK FORCE

The generosity and hospitality of the Munsey congregation was evident throughout April with the hosting of 5 work groups and 47 volunteers as they shared their time and talents with Appalachia Service Project (ASP) to rebuild homes destroyed by Hurricane Helene flooding. Munsey also hosted 20 Holston Conference disaster recovery case workers who underwent a week-long UMCOR disaster training at Munsey. Since September, ASP has built more than 20 homes (with a goal to rebuild or repair 200 homes), and Munsey has provided support with financial gifts in addition to hosting volunteer groups. The year's generous Easter offering will enable us to donate over \$11,589 for rebuilding homes in Embreeville, TN and recovery efforts in Bishop, VA.







The first picture above is the original site of three homes owned by the White family. "For generations, they lived together in a community known as Bumpus Cove, but when Hurricane Helene hit, everything changed. Their homes were destroyed, and they were forced to live apart in borrowed campers." (ASP April newsletter). The second and third photos show one of the new White family homes and the progress made by work groups hosted by Munsey.

#### NORTH SIDE ELEMENTARY--- A GREAT PLACE TO BE!

Dr. Sibylle Kranz wrote about the effects of hunger that, "...having children who are well-fed and not hungry makes a difference in their individual performance." It has been well documented that students do better on standardized testing if they are not hungry. At North Side, 139 students in third through fifth grade took TCAP tests for four days starting on April 15.

Munsey came to the rescue! Thanks to the Context and Open Door Sunday School classes, numerous individuals, and the designated funds for North Side, we were able to donate the following:

- 663 drinks (juice and water)
- 476 cereal bars
- 520 cheese treats
- 574 fruit snacks



With all these generous snacks, the children will not go hungry during testing! In addition, 6 pairs of sweatpants, 2 pairs of leggings and boys' tank tops and 10 pairs of girls' briefs were added to last months' giving.

In April, we collected Kleenex for the classrooms and water for field day. May's collection will be Related Arts supplies. There will be a list at the Missions table, and items can be placed in the green barrel near the Connection Point.

# MINISTRY SPOTLIGHT FROM CASEY & JAMIE PRICE

For us, Munsey represents an oasis of reasoned Christian practice firmly emplaced within East Tennessee's ephemeral religious landscape. Jamie and I experienced incredibly disparate upbringings regarding church life despite similar backgrounds. It took us many years to synthesize each perspective into a viable analytical framework for growing together as Christians. During our process, we attended several types of local churches. Some more traditional congregations seemed parochial and alienating. We attended other less traditional congregations that tend to materialize in old Dollar General buildings, which felt like a mixture of a 90s rock concert and a live infomercial. We realized many of these churches espoused values predicated on fear and insularity, often reflecting mercurial interpretations of trendy social issues. These experiences helped us define the nature of the type of congregation we sought to augment. After having two children, we realized the necessity of finding a church aligned with our journey to understand Jesus's teachings better and how to implement them in our interactions with others.

We have known Jay and Sunny Sandos, as well as Dr. Tom Lee, for many years. We knew both emphasized the same Christian attributes we value and had witnessed them many times implementing these in their lives. We began attending

Munsey, hoping that others in the congregation would reflect the same thoughtful approach to Christian life as they do. Munsey's members exceeded our expectations. Upon attending Sunday School at Dr. Lee's invitation, we found members of the group conducting the communal and often vexing theological work required to better understand and incorporate the teachings in an ancient text few of us can read. The discussion reflected the type of critical engagement with Biblical texts we find fosters a holistic perspective of God's connection with each of us individually and collectively. We knew we were among our people. We thank everyone that has been so welcoming to us and each other. We are proud to be a part of a church community in East Tennessee that exemplifies Christianity's foundational tenant of love for God and each other, *tout le monde*.
